

About this Guide

This guide only covers in detail pubs that sell at least one beer from an independent brewer. Note that both Greene King (who also own Belhaven brewery) and Marston's (who also own Banks, Brakspear, Jennings, Ringwood and Wychwood breweries) have now expanded hugely in recent years and are classified as national brewers.

However, to encourage those pubs which try to provide a range of real ales, but do not always include at least one independent ale, a short section at the end of each section gives brief details of those which stock two or more real ales from any source.

Pubs which have gained entry into the Good Beer Guide 2011 have been given a photograph.




